GRACE KOURY



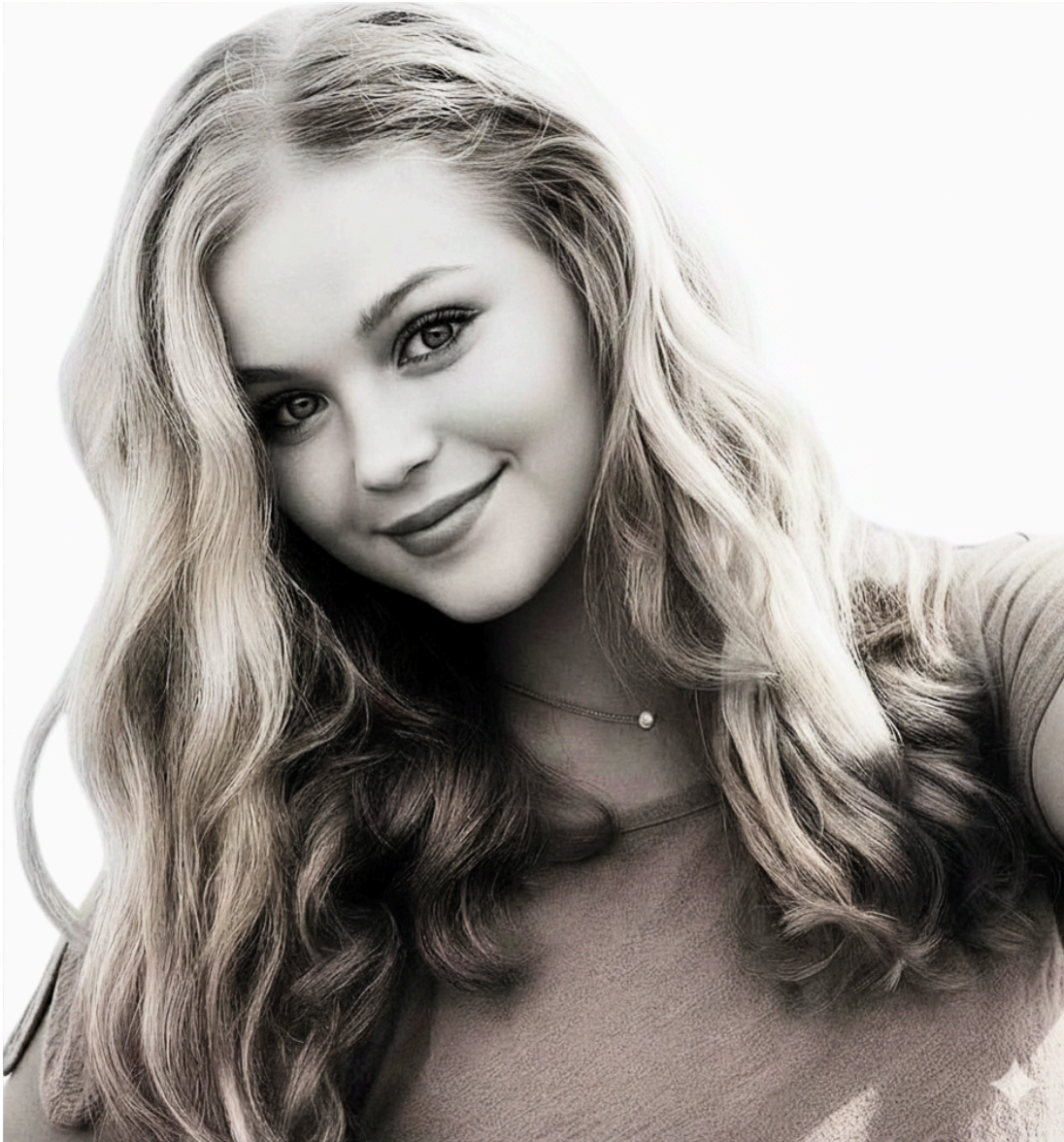
